Dear friends in Christ

Fall is a time for learning – the school buses are rolling and students have returned to their classrooms! Learning is also important for us as Christians. In the Great Commission, Jesus told his disciples,

"Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and <u>teaching them to obey everything that I have commanded you</u>." Matthew 28:19-20a

So as followers of Christ, we have an obligation to both learn and teach – and it doesn't end with confirmation!

But in some ways learning – and teaching – as followers of Christ is very different from grade school or college. For what does it mean to be a child of God? Baptized, redeemed, loved? Who is this God who claims us as His own? That's a mystery we'll spend our lives unraveling!

Study in the Christian church is not just acquiring facts: instead it is faith seeking understanding. And faith is rooted in relationship.

So how can we get to know this unseen God who loves us? By cracking open our bibles – for in the gospels, Jesus reveals God to us. If we take time to read the gospels for ourselves, over and over, then the person of Jesus takes on life: he steps off the pages and into our hearts.

I suggest you start with the gospel of Luke. Read it slowly, savouring the words. When you get to the 4<sup>th</sup> chapter you'll read:

"The Spirit of the Lord is upon me, because he has anointed me to bring good news to the poor. He has sent me to proclaim release to the captives and recovery of sight to the blind, to let the oppressed go free..." [Luke 4:18-19]

Those words are living and they are meant for you and me.

Learning takes on another whole dimension when we take what we have learned and put it to work. That's the lifelong journey called discipleship and there we learn by obedience. That's more challenging than reading our bibles! Consider these words of Jesus:

"This is my commandment, that you love one another as I have loved you.

No one has greater love than this, to lay down one's life for one's friends."

[John 15:12-13]

The good news is this: as we practice the self-giving love of Jesus, our faith deepens and we come closer to the God who loves us.

So as the students return to school, let us become students too - reacquainting ourselves with the teachings of Jesus and putting them into action.

## Green Team Remains Busy

The Green Team continues to work with the youth to implement a 'Stewardship of Creation' at St. Peter's. The most recent update has been the installation of a cone digester outside of the kitchen porch. All food scraps- including meats, coffee grounds, and napkins- can be put into the digester. This will cut down on our contribution to the landfill and create nutrient-rich soil for gardening. A green caddy can be found on the counter for convenient transport from the kitchen to the digester. Keep your eyes open for more greening of the church throughout the fall!
