It is a tradition of long standing that Lent should be a penitential season. Jesus died in order to forgive our sins, and so we should feel sorry for sinning.

But I have been wondering for some years if we are not denying the Christ's good gift to us by any practice of penitence. He died in order that we might have an abundant life, not a penitential one!

And generally our penitence has devolved into giving up something for Lent, usually something

which doesn't matter very much anyway. I could give up chocolate for Lent. Of course, after Lent I'd be back at the chocolate. But my crabapple tree doesn't eat chocolate for Lent, either, and it makes about as much difference. Occasionally we might give up a habit like smoking, that affects our health, and we continue after Lent is over. That's a better approach. It would be what God wants for us. We might give up desserts during Lent, and send the money saved to a charity. That would also be an appropriate approach to some kind of spiritual discipline.

I personally choose only to focus on the Christ's sacrifice for me, and then to try to live to the fullest the kind of life he intended by his sacrifice - a full life, a forgiven life, a life modeled on his own. Then I find that what I need to give up are not so much sweets and habits, but selfishness and similar attitudes. And that's a far harder discipline, and a far more rewarding one.

A Message to the Members of St. Peter's from Church Council Chair, Mark Heimrich.

Several of you have wondered about or questioned the set up of Pastor Dick's schedule. I'd like to share how this came to be. Firstly, Pastor Dick was appointed by Synod to act as our interim Pastor. It is customary for church councils to accept Synod's decision on who will serve them during a vacancy. Ultimately there are not many choices and we liked what we heard about Pastor Dick. I, and council as a whole, discussed and negotiated with Pastor Dick what level of service we were looking for and what he was comfortable providing. We came up with what was an amicable schedule for all.

The general outline is and likely will remain as follows:

Pastor Dick will be with us for the 1st and 3rd Sundays of each month (Holy Communion) and on Festival Sundays when Communion is celebrated. He is conducting visiting on Tuesdays and attending council meetings and confirmation. He is extremely well organized and I would say is providing good value for our time. Pastor Dick is at our service for any and all pastoral needs. Keep in mind Tuesday is generally the day he is in and around Zurich. Pastor Dick & Linda's phone number in Woodstock is 519-537-8948. It was a joint decision between Pastor Dick and Council for him to attend approximately every other Sunday. He is writing or supplying a sermon for the alternate Sundays as most of you are aware. We pay him for his prep time with regard to the sermons. This overall scheduling decision was reached based on a few factors:

- Pastor Dick is actually retired and preferred not to come every Sunday. He was, however, willing if we really wanted him to. He was and is remaining very accommodating to our needs.
- The Synod prescribed mileage charge is .49 cents per km. Therefore the mileage alone is just over \$100 per trip, two ways, back and forth to Woodstock. Council felt we could save on some of this. Obviously he is also paid for his time on the road too.
- Council also felt we could also save by having members participate in conducting services and reading sermons. It has worked well so far, however we are still looking for more volunteers to lead the liturgy and deliver the sermon. Please see me or Jen Schellenberger to say "YES" I would like to volunteer and to arrange a Sunday. Volunteers are in place for February but are still needed for March 14th.
- As the call process unfolds, we should have the opportunity to elicit the services of the four new student candidates who will be graduating from our Synod this year. This is an opportunity to use their services (to fill in on Sundays) and see how they "fit" our church and congregation.
- Our budget we have run a deficit for three years in a row. We're trying to be prudent with church money!

I hope this helps to explain the structure we have employed with Pastor Dick. If you have any questions or suggestions please contact me or any other member of your Church Council.

Thanks to Mark Heimrich, Ron Heimrich, Tracy Lather, Charlotte Norton, Jenni Boles and Peter Bornath for their leadership at the Sunday worship services on the Sundays when Pastor Dick was not presiding the past 3 months.

Terrorist Groups Operating in Churches
