
#### **REMINDERS:**

#### From the Anniversary Committee:

The January 2<sup>nd</sup> 150<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Kickoff Sunday was a huge success. Jacklyn Rader's 'Me to We' presentation was excellent and inspiring for all of us.

The choir's anthem "Come Build a Church" left everybody humming its catchy melody and we look forward to hearing it again in the future.

The first Constitution of the Evangelical Lutheran and Reformed Church developed by Rev. Muenzinger (Michele Haberer) received an overwhelming approval. Almost all the male members of the congregation renewed the 96 signatures of January 1, 1861. Despite Mother's (Lois Thiel) attempt to keep Otto (Douglas Klopp) who was not yet 21 from signing, he did sign the document at the end of the service. Marguerite (Diane Klopp) expressed her disapproval of the discrimination against women, when she could not participate. Thank you to Alma Westlake for writing the script.

The Levee after the service provided an opportunity for guests to celebrate the anniversary of the acceptance of the first constitution 150 years ago. Several guests dressed in period costume for the occasion. Our 150th anniversary placemats which were donated by a member of our congregation were used for the first time.

On January 9, the congregation unanimously approved "that the Anniversary Committee proceed with plans to restore the pioneer cemetery provided that the funding for part or all of it becomes available, with the church/cemetery board being responsible for up to \$10,000." This support for the first cemetery is appreciated and the committee will undertake to find funding to complete the project.



Sunday, February 13<sup>th</sup>, at the worship service, the Valentine's gifts that have been "lovingly" provided by several members of our congregation will be blessed prior to giving them to Blessings for distribution. This outreach project spearheaded by the Anniversary Committee has been a huge success. 45 female social service recipients will be surprised and honoured with a small gift on Valentine's Day. Thank you to everyone for their support...your response has been amazing.

A Women's Spa Day will be held Sunday, April 10, in the afternoon. Watch for announcements of other anniversary activities as plans are finalized.

The Anniversary Committee hopes to compile a pictorial history of the past 150 years at St. Peter's. We are searching for old photos of family events which occurred in the church, old photos of the church &/or church activities such as Sunday School Picnics, Youth Group, Ladies groups, Choir. #### 150 years ago February 1861 The German Language

"German" is the first word in the original name of St. Peter's congregation at the official organization on January 1, 1861. An examination of the baptismal records reveals that these people came from Hessia, Baden, Prussia, Alsace-Lorraine, Mecklenburg, Bavaria, Saxony, Schleswig-Holstein, Hannover, Wuertemberg, and from Waterloo County, Pennsylvania and Hamilton.

For almost fifty years all records (except one) were written in the German language. One exception is the marriage records. Reverend J.N. Muenzinger copied the first twenty one marriages into English in 1864. Subsequent records of marriages are written in English.

To satisfy a growing need at this time among the youth, English services were introduced in 1908 on Sunday evenings. This was the beginning of the difficult but necessary transition from the German to the English language that continued for many years.

#### **How to be Green this Winter**

- Make a conscious decision to "Go Green".
- "Follow through" on all the Green tips you already know.
- Read books on protecting the environment to get more tips.
- "Cuddle Up" using blankets made from organically grown natural fibres like cotton or wool. (If you have to choose a manmade fibre, choose polyester over acrylic.)
- About 40% of "heat loss" is from wall/floor joints, doors and windows. Use a lit beeswax candle to check for drafts in these areas and seal them up.
  - Allow sunlight in during the day for "passive solar heating" and close blinds and curtains each night to keep the heat in.
  - If you can, boost the insulation of roofs, attics, floors, walls and basements to keep you toasty warm in winter (and cool in summer).
    - -Use a ceiling fan on low to push the warm air down
- -Turn your thermostat down or use a programmable thermostat when you are away during the day.



#### PAST EVENTS

In November at a Youth Group planning meeting it was decided that due to declining attendance by the youth, we would join with the confirmation class (who are youth age) to put on a series of Youth services and other events at our church.

In December, the Youth had a ball doing Christmas stuff. After a delicious Pizza supper, thanks to Parish Life, we went Christmas carolling with other members of St. Peter's. We helped the Trivitt Youth Group decorate their church; in return some of the Trivitt youth (along with other churches in Zurich) came out and helped with Zurich's Live Nativity. On January 30<sup>th,</sup> St. Peter's Youth will be leading the worship service on the Beatitudes. As always we would appreciate your support.

#### **FUNDRAISING**

At the end of **CLAY** (Canadian Lutheran Anglican Youth Gathering) (<a href="www.clay2010.ca">www.clay2010.ca</a>), a youth initiative was set for the attendees to take back to their churches, deaneries, dioceses, and synods. We were asked to raise the money to build 12 sustainable communities in developing countries by 2012. "12 for 2012". It costs approximately \$5000 to make a community sustainable in a developing country. So, through **Canadian Lutheran World Relief** (CLWR), and **Primate's World Relief and Development Fund** (PWRDF) the Anglican Church of Canada's agency, a portion of all money raised by our youth group will go towards "12 for 2012". It is our hope that between our group and the other groups who attend SOC events that we can raise \$5000 in the next two years for the 12 for 2012 initiative.
