
For Sale:

Sunday School Sponsorship Update through Plan Canada

St. Peter's Sunday School has supported a foster child for many years through Plan Canada (formerly Foster Parents Plan) and we would like to share an update with you. Tesema Gerja Ejato is 15 years old and lives in the Shebedino (south) area in Ethiopia.

"Tesema does not attend formal education because primary education is not currently considered important by the family. Plan Canada tries to ensure all children have access to educational opportunities. Ultimately, the decision remains with the family. According to the family, Tesema has been healthy and has not suffered from any serious illness.

Initiatives funded by our generous contributions help our sponsored child by building and strengthening their community. These initiatives include:

- Training for health workers on care and prevention for children under 5
- Teacher training
- Training in management of natural resources
- Agricultural training for farmers
- Activities that promote protection of children from abuse, exploitation and neglect.



Next year priorities: Plan Canada will focus on strengthening village saving and loan group, livestock development, promotion of community sanitation, implementation of integrated management of childhood illness, constructing safe drinking water, promotion of family planning, prevention of violence at schools and support youth initiatives.

Be part of something extraordinary

It is our hope that we can continue to support a foster child through the Sunday School offerings. It is our biggest expenditure at \$111 per guarter. However, we still feel it is important to offer our Sunday School children a variety of activities such as the picnics and bowling to promote attendance. We would like some input from the congregation how we can keep supporting this worthwhile project without sacrificing our own program.
