HERITAGE QUILT EXHIBIT Michele Haberer is looking for old quilts and needlework for the second "Heritage Quilt Exhibit" to be held at Trivitt Anglican Church in Exeter. This event will run for 3 days this year – Thursday, April 11, from 10 - 7 p.m., Friday, April 12, from 10 - 7 p.m. and Saturday, April 13, from 10 - 4 p.m. This will be similar to the popular quilt show that was held 2 years ago with 1,000 people attending to admire the 100 beautiful heritage quilts.
